

Amends Chapter 951 (Crimes Against Animals), Section 951.18 (Penalties) of Wisconsin Statutes to revise the penalty for animal abuse from a Class C forfeiture to a Class I felony. Provides that a person who commits an act of animal abuse is guilty of a Class I felony if the animal abuse results in grievous bodily harm to or the death of the animal or if the person knows or reasonably should know that the animal abuse may result in grievous bodily harm to or the death of an animal, regardless of whether grievous bodily harm or death occurs. Provides that a court may order that a person who commits an act of animal abuse person may not reside with any animal or type or species of animal, for a period of up to 15 years if the person is convicted of a felony violation.

Amends Chapter 173 (Animals; Humane Officers) of Wisconsin Statutes to create Section 173.90 (Preemption of local animal regulations) relating to the state preemption of certain local animal ordinances. Prohibits political subdivisions from adopting certain regulations for animal facilities in areas that are zoned exclusively or primarily for agricultural use, unless the activity being regulated presents a substantial threat to public health or safety. Prohibits political subdivisions from establishing animal welfare standards that are more stringent than those contained in state law or from requiring or prohibiting animal medications or vaccinations that are not otherwise required or prohibited under state law.
